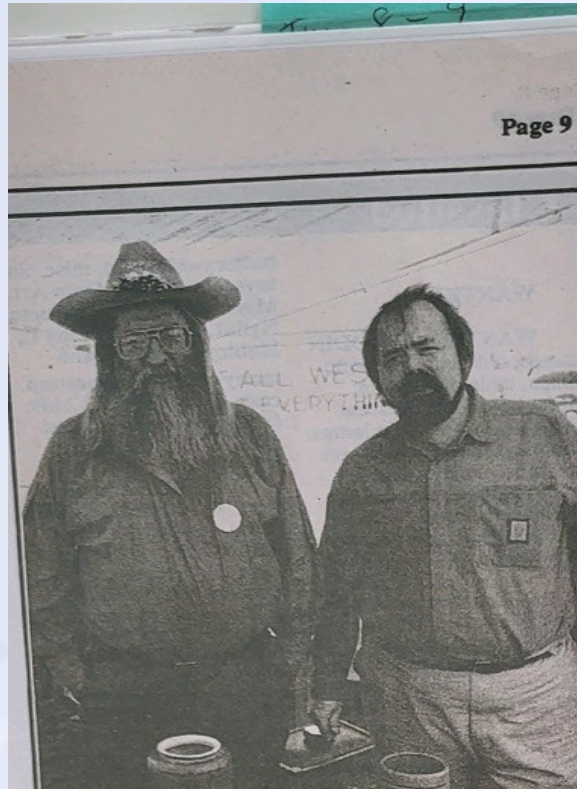
## North Dakota Pottery Collectors to Meet

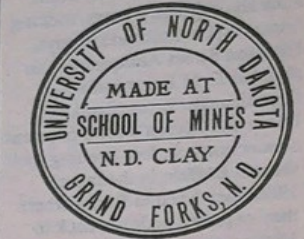
Events scheduled are a banquet, a tour of the historic Bagg Farm, an auction, and a show and sale of North Dakota pottery pieces.

## North Dakota pottery fires collectors' enthusiasm

Auction set for June 8

Looking west across the vast grasslands of North Dakota, many a traveler has doubtless wondered what this land is good for — aside from planting wheat in rows so straight you could set your ruler by 'em and find nary a stalk out of line, in fields so level you could plow with eyes closed and never feel a hillock or bump into a stone or a tree.

But North Dakotans — those who stayed — suspected there might be more beneath the surface.

For example, Earle J. Babcock, a young professor at the University of North Dakota at Grand Forks, began researching the state's mineral deposits in the 1890s. In 1901, Babcock reported deposits of lignite coal, which became very valuable, and clay suitable for pottery.

With the founding of the University's School of Mines at Grand Forks in 1901, students and

## Pottery Collectors Society donates to Historical Society

The North Dakota Pottery Collectors Society voted to donate \$1,000 to the Richland County Historical Society at its recent annual convention in Fargo.

The donation to the Historical Society which operates the Richland County Historical Museum in Wahpeton is a first for the Collectors Association, according to its president, Con Short, Beach, N.D. The group hopes to make similar donations to other worthy organizations in the coming years.

Short appointed Polly Benn coeman, Wahpeton, Dorothy Island, Moorhead, and Peter pert, Devils Lake, to a newly-named Education and Endowment Committee. The trio will draft applications and make re-

commendations to the society for future grants. Funds for the grants will come from membership dues and a pottery auction held at its yearly convention.

Founded in 1980 to foster interest in North Dakota pottery, the Collectors Society now numbers over 300 members from throughout the country.

Some of the most collectible North Dakota pottery include UND, Dickota, Three Tribes, W.P.A., and Rosemeade which was manufactured at the Wahpeton Pottery Co. from 1940 to 1959.

Rosemeade's creator, Laura Taylor Hughes, and her husband, Robert, owned and operated the pottery factory. It closed following Mrs. Hughes' death. The remaining pottery was donated to the local museum, allow-

ing it to boast the largest Rosemeade collection in the country. This feature made it a natural to be the first recipient of a grant by the Collectors Society, according to Short.

The \$1,000 will be used for a special project, according to Elaine Wold, Wahpeton, president of the Historical Society. The museum operates largely on volunteer help and a county mill levy which raises approximately \$7,000 a year. Some funds are also received from the Hughes' estate. Wold said projects being considered by the directors are a sign on Second Street designating the museum as the "Home of Rosemeade Pottery," and/or a new display cabinet for the museum.

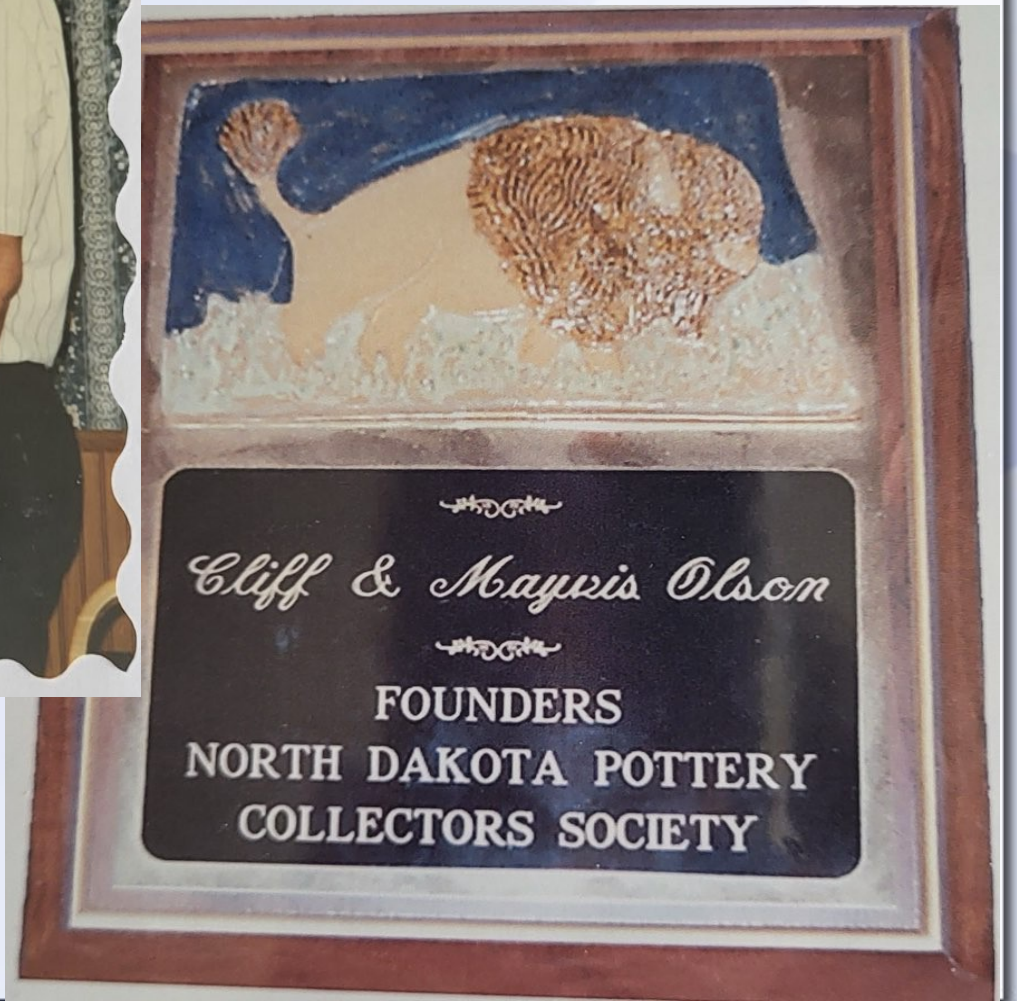

This is not part of the Cor thought would be fun to do, sin and may not be this way again!



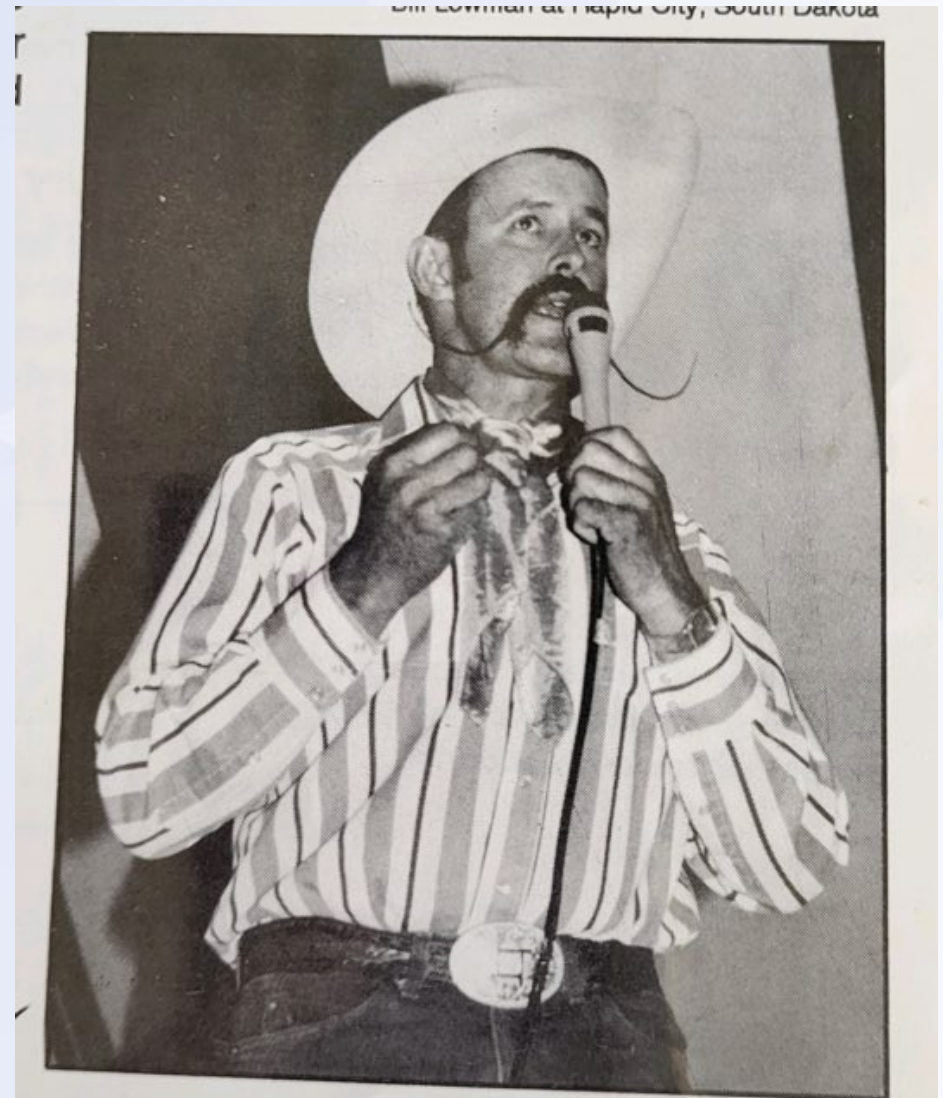

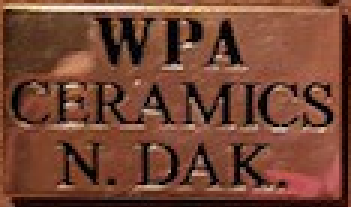

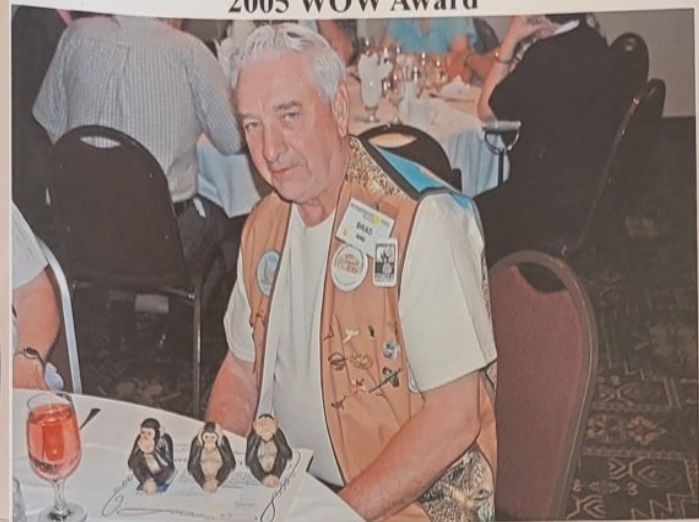

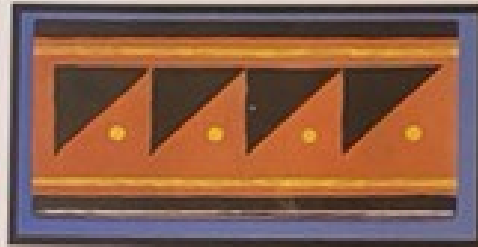
