





You had a choice of colors of the roses, pink or maroon and the size was  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " by 2". There were no specials made in 1991 but there were two artist proofs and the size was  $3\frac{3}{4}$ " by  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " with AP marked on the back. Notice the spelling of collectors on the artist proof. One of these was given to Cliff & Mayvis Olson and the other one was put in the auction. There were 200 regular commemoratives made in 1991.








