If an item is found to be damaged or repaired after the auction has ended, the buyer should contact the owner of that item to resolve the matter.

Members submitting lots that are not in the condition stated (Example: Listing an item as MINT when it is damaged or repaired) will not be allowed to put items in the next year's NDPCS auction. All lots are subject to the inspection methods used by the auction committee.
